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To All Watertown Housing Authority Residents:

This is a very important information, please have this translated if needed. Due to the increasing number of COVID-19 positive cases in Watertown and its surrounding area, WHA wants to remind everyone about the important health guidelines that all WHA properties must adhere to:

- Always maintain social distancing!
- Stay home whenever possible
- Avoid unnecessary travel
- Avoid large gatherings of any kind, whether on WHA properties or not
- Do not enter the dwelling of another resident and discourage children from doing so as well, even as the temperature begins to drop and playing outside is less of an option
- Adults and children above 2 must wear face coverings when on WHA properties. There are no reasonable accommodations for this mandate
- Limit in-person playtime and connect virtually with other children
- Clean and disinfect frequently surfaces daily
- Wash your hands for 20 seconds under hot water when returning to your dwelling
- Unwarranted guests are not allowed on WHA properties during this unprecedented time – this includes family members and friends
